

Safe Routes to School Tucson Resources

Riders & Walkers: is an interactive, multi-media presentation created and delivered by the Environmental Education Exchange for **3rd grade classrooms** across Pima County. During this 45-minute presentation, student teams help Sofia and Santiago safely navigate their route to school by bike and on foot. The presenter guides students through a Chutes & Ladders-inspired game that reviews pedestrian and bicycle safety skills and builds enthusiasm to get students ready to ride and walk.

In the 2017-18 school year, **100 Riders & Walkers presentations** will be completed at the end of May 2018, reaching **35 schools** and **2,500 students** across Pima County.

Mobile Bike Repair Clinics: Mobile bike repair is a **free service** offered to kids at all Tucson SRTS pilot schools and is available to additional area schools upon request.

Most bike repair events take place directly after the school day, or can be paired with a special school or community activity. We prepare a promotional flyer, customized to the school and event, ready for you to print and distribute in advance so kids now when to bring bikes.

Trained mechanics provide materials/parts, expertise, and basic mechanic instruction to participants. Kids not only leave with their bikes tuned up, but also with basic knowledge of bike maintenance. Request a visit by completing our online form:
